



COMPUMEDICS HOSPITAL COUP

DEALS

MEDICAL device maker Compumedics has secured two contracts to supply its sleep and neuro diagnostic equipment to hospitals.

The Melbourne-based company said the contracts helped with its goal of growing its core businesses, including neuro diagnostics, into international markets including the US.

It has struck a \$1.13 million deal with the University Hospital in Wisconsin, US, and a \$700,000 deal with The Children's Hospital at Westmead in Sydney.

“The addition of these key reference sites positions Compumedics well to continue to grow its neuro diagnostic business in the US and around the world,” chairman and chief executive David Burton said.

The *Herald Sun* reported earlier this week that

Compumedics, based in Abbotsford, had developed a wearable device expected to revolutionise the way consumers and health professionals monitor sleep patterns.

Called the Somfit, it weighs 20g, is the size of a 20c piece, and monitors

brainwaves, eye movement, breathing and other activity.

Compumedics shares closed at 40c.
