## Narrow hit for Impact

**MORE promising mineralisation has been hit at Impact Minerals' Platinum Springs project but given its narrowness more interest will be in a new downhole EM survey that will assist targeting of future drilling.**

*Impact's holdings near Broken Hill:*



Impact announced a 60cm thick zone of nickel-copper sulphide had been hit with assays expected in about 5-6 weeks.

The company said there was “considerable difference in the modelled orientation and geometry between the two surveys already completed”, suggesting the possibility of better widths remains.

Platinum Springs is part of Impact's tenements in the Broken Hill region comprising a 40km trend of rocks prospective for two distinct styles of mineralisation: PGE-copper-nickel mineralisation in ultramafic rocks at Platinum Springs, and Broken Hill-style zinc-lead-silver prospects in the Red Hill project.

Impact is backed by Andrew Forrest's private firm Squadron Resources.

Meanwhile Impact is gearing up for drilling its Commonwealth gold-silver-base metal project in NSW.

Shares in Impact were off 3% to A2.9c in late afternoon trade, capitalising the company at about \$20 million.

Impact is estimated to hold just under \$4 million cash.
